SHOP LOCAL

One goal of Friends of Point Grey Village is to encourage the community to shop at local businesses so we were very pleased to receive the note below in response to the last newsletter.

“I’m letting you know that your recommendation to support the hood caused me to go out and spend nearly \$300 at the pharmacy and I plan a trip to the hardware. I always buy my coffee at Bean and will do some coffee gift-giving to further support them. And will explore other ways to re-localize my business.”—CC

That’s the spirit—RE-LOCALIZE. Love it.

And coffee as a gift is a fabulous idea. There are currently 108 businesses that are members of the Point Grey Business Improvement Association (BIA). Let us know what creative ideas you have to support them.

Point Grey BIA Efforts to Improve Safety and Attractiveness of 10th Avenue

The BIA works hard to help improve the prosperity of the Village. It has a limited budget pooled from each business member. The visible benefits we all enjoy are the clean sidewalks, the beautification of the Village through the planting of flower beds, the benches, the hanging baskets, the mural in the plaza, and tree/Christmas lights. The BIA also hosts many promotional activities to help support local businesses.

In recent years, there is a growing recognition of how a safe and attractive street environment contributes to the prosperity of commercial areas. Cities all over the world have reduced speed limits in commercial areas. In many cases, the speed limit has been reduced from 50 kmh to 40 kmh and in some cases from 50kmh to 30kmh.



In addition to revitalized shopping districts, the results have been astounding in lives saved,

reduced injury, and much reduced insurance rates because of lower crash rates. The City of Victoria just adopted a 40 kmh speed limit for most of its arterial streets.

With the help of Councillors Dominato and Fry, the Engineering Department was asked to investigate the incidence of crashes and speed on 10th Avenue in 2023. A meeting was held between the BIA Traffic Committee and City Engineering staff in July 2024.

The results showed that about 15% of the cars were exceeding 50 kmh. Crash rates were significant at some intersections over the last five years. Engineering staff stated that Discovery and Trimble intersections were close to needing a full traffic light but that the wait for a new traffic light would probably be years long. Staff recommended that crashes at Trimble could be reduced through improving visibility by removing parking spaces near the intersection.

The Point Grey Village BIA followed up with a letter to the City of Vancouver on October 30, 2024 asking the City to undertake the following improvements on 10th Avenue to assist in the safety and revitalization of the neighbourhood centre (see below). City staff responded with little enthusiasm to take action on any of the items, except removing parking spots near Trimble. The BIA will continue to pursue these important actions:

1. Place “Welcome to Point Grey Village” signs at each end of the village with a 40 km speed limit sign and accompanied by whatever other street markings are needed to help enforce this speed.
2. Undertake a full analysis to determine whether Discovery and/or Trimble warrant a full traffic signal and likely time frame for implementation.
3. Provide the following improvements in conjunction with the Safeway site redevelopment:
 - A full traffic signal at Tolmie
 - A full traffic signal at Sasamat, to accompany the additional entrance to the future Safeway development off Sasamat as shown in the revised Safeway site proposal of July 2024
 - A mid-block pedestrian crossing between Sasamat and Tolmie to increase safety and assist with traffic calming, given the long length of the blocks in the village and the trips that will be generated by the new grocery store and residents.
 - Sidewalks of at least 22 feet in depth at 4545 West 10th Ave. (Safeway site) to provide for merchandise display, outdoor cafes/restaurants, bike parking, public seating and generous tree/shrub planting.

4. Remove parking spaces at Trimble that impact visibility to reduce crashes and enhance pedestrian safety.

Mayor and Council, please support the efforts of the BIA and the prosperity and safety of the Village by allocating City budget. Apart from the pop-up plaza, there has been no City investment in the Village for over 25 years. We residents and businesses want to see at least some of our property taxes spent locally.
